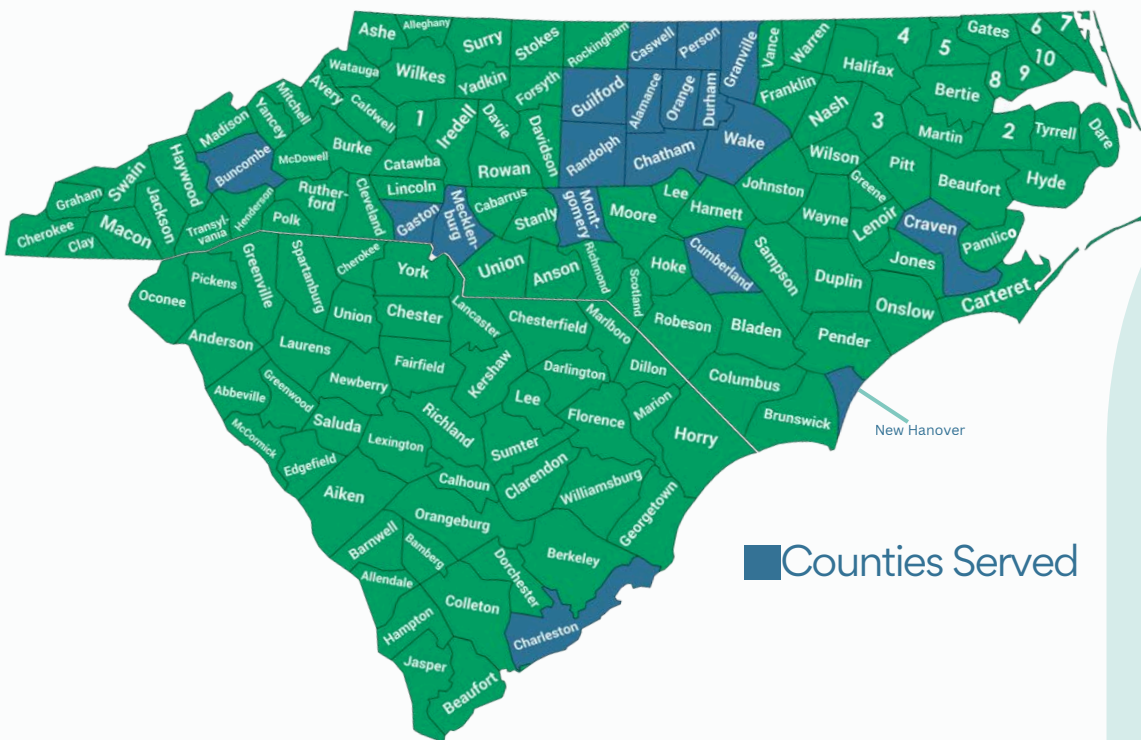

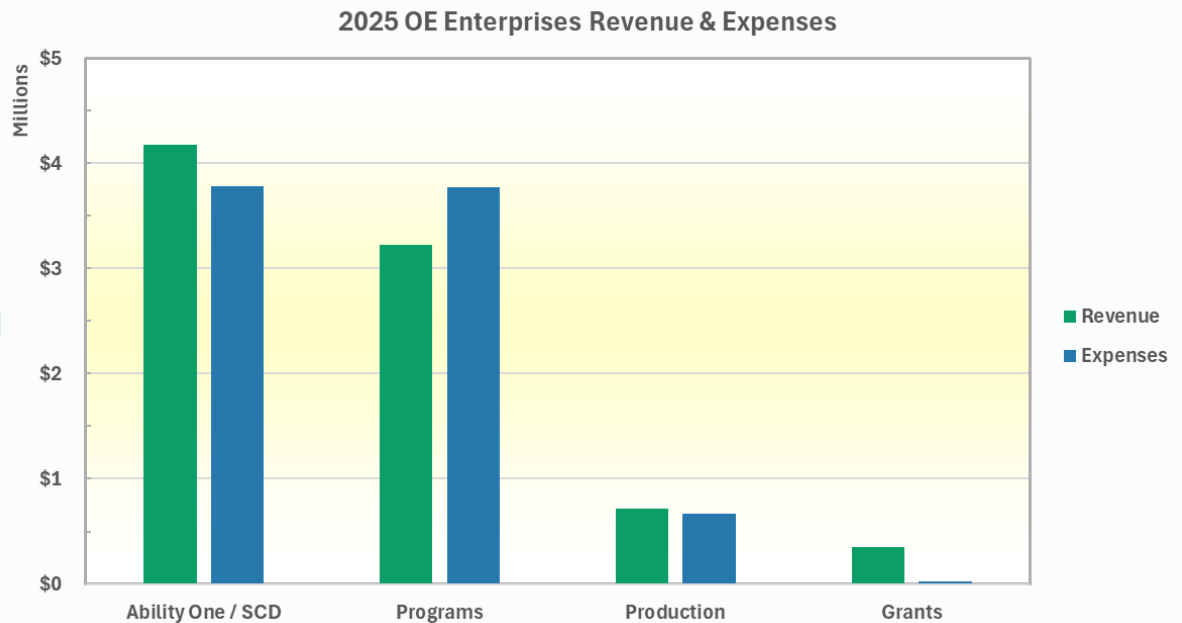


FINANCIAL REVIEW

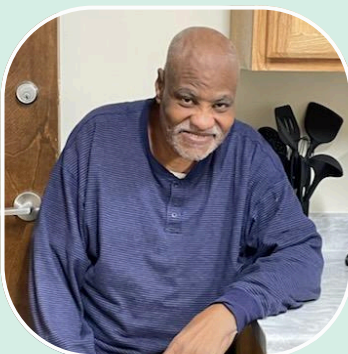
The Day Supports program aims to promote independence and overall well-being for individuals with disabilities, helping them to lead fulfilling lives and participate actively in their communities.
